

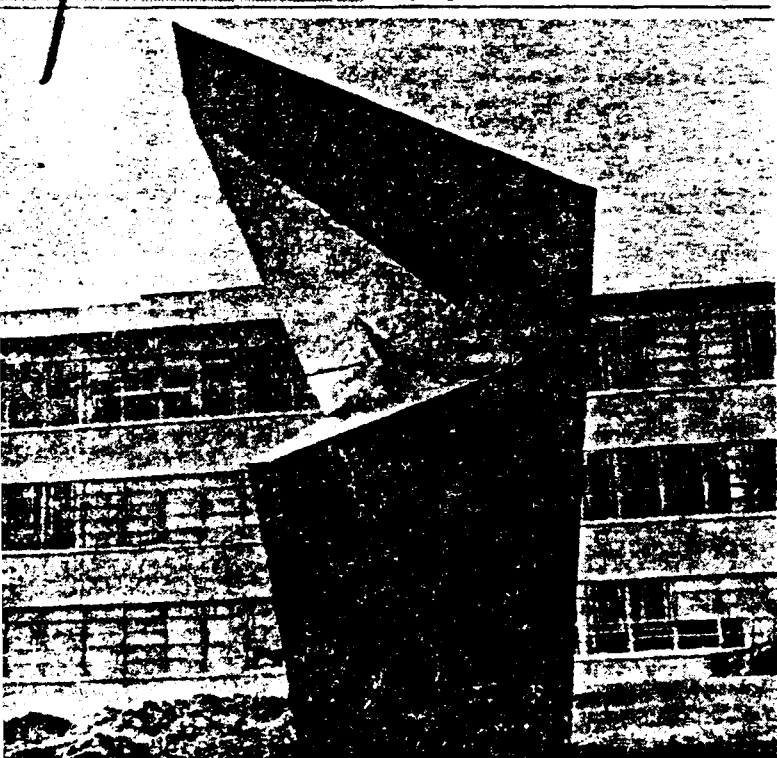
Sculpture Documentary Filmed By NBC for Fall Showing

If you happen to have noticed some people on campus wielding what looked like a TV camera, here is some news for you—it is a TV camera, and they are a crew from NBC TV, who are making a documentary film of the current sculpture symposium, to be shown on television sometime in September.

Producer-director Marc Breslow, as he was overheard to explain to his assistants during filming last week, plans to tape interviews with all the sculptors, and film each of their projects at different stages of growth. These shots, taken from the same camera points, will then be put together in what is like the time-lapse photography of nature films — (remember Walt Disney making flowers grow?), and the voice of the sculptor added as a running commentary.

Last week, the NBC people worked with sculptors Azuma, Kohn, Kosso, and Pommodoro—as well as with painter Rita Letendre, a young lady from Montreal who is creating a mural over the archway adjoining LA-5. (Perhaps you have seen her with one of her assistants, poring over plans and sketches on the grass, looking like two students studying notes for a test.)

The NBC crew will be on campus Friday, when sculptor Murray's piece is expected to be flown to its site by helicopter. They will be filming until the symposium ends in mid-August.
