


THE ONTARIO BICENTENNIAL SCULPTURE AND TIME CAPSULE DEDICATION CEREMONY

Ontario Place

June 30, 1986



The Bicentennial Sculpture and Time Capsule, by sculptor Kosso Eloul, is comprised of a "flying column" symbolizing the future, suspended between two outer columns which stand for the first two centuries of Ontario's history.

The "flying column" of the Sculpture also encases the Time Capsule. The Capsule contains artifacts and memorabilia contributed by hundreds of communities that participated in the Ontario Bicentennial Celebrations of 1984.

Personal and hopeful messages from today's children to future generations have also been placed in the Capsule, along with arts and crafts and mementos from many walks of contemporary Ontario life.

Kosso Eloul has created the visionary Bicentennial Sculpture from "living steel". The passage of time will age and darken the material (Stelcoloy) so that it will take on a brownish-blue patina.

The Time Capsule is to be opened in 2084 as a Tricentennial gift to the people of Ontario.
